Welcome to New Year 2023! Nanyima Care is wishing you all a Happy and Prosperous New Year as we say goodbye to the year that has been 2022. With A COVID-19 Outbreak and Lockdown announced on Christmas Day 2022, we are still in the middle of managing this situation. Supported by every single concerned stakeholder, we are positive that we will get through this with the best outcome for all.

Last year was extremely packed with the introductions of many initiatives from the Department of Health and Aged Care, and Aged Care Quality Standards Commissioner as they roll out some of their Royal Commission Enquiry Recommendation responses.

Most recently, the Code of Conduct for Aged Care was commenced in December 2022. Nanyima Care ensured that all staff, volunteers, and our governance body – Committee of Management members were all given a copy of the code.

Star Rating published on My Aged Care website commenced in December 2022 as well. Our overall Star Rating is currently not available on My Aged Care website due to a missing component – staffing. Nanyima Aged Care has provided the required reporting for this component but still, the website has not been updated. What you would find on My Aged Care website is that Nanyima Aged Care has 5 stars for Compliance, 4 stars for Residents' Experience, and 3 stars for Quality Measures. We are currently in communication with the department in the aim of having our overall rating available.

AN-ACC Classification with attached care minute requirements commenced in October 2022 and these care minute requirements are to be mandatory requirements for us by October 2023.

Governance Reform for Residential Aged Care Facilities was also commenced last year. Nanyima Care governance body will be attending coaching sessions to have the full refresh on understanding and knowledge for the new expected governance role in the industry. There is a requirement to engage an Advisory Board Committee and Consumer Advisory Committee within the governance and we are hoping to achieve this for Nanyima Care.

A draft of the new Aged Care Quality Standard was released last year for consultation process, and this is likely to be finalised this year. From eight (8) standards, it was

proposed to have seven (7) standards. We will provide you with more details on this as it becomes available.

We are still up for Accreditation and working together in ensuring that we are always here for our residents. Thank you for your ongoing support.

PALLIATIVE CARE MUSIC THERAPY



The Reverie Harp is a relatively new type of instrument - co-designed by Australia's only certified Music Thanatologist, Peter Roberts - for use in bedside Music Care in hospital and other health-care settings. Peter designed an instrument that is lovely to hold, lovely to hear, and can

be played by anyone, even those with no musical experience at all.

Because of its appeal in every human dimension, music has tremendous therapeutic capacity, often helping people to open up even if they are no longer able to communicate with words.

With this in mind, the Reverie Harp has become a must have tool for music therapists, visitation ministry and chaplains, diversional therapy and nursing home care-givers and volunteers.

This harp is now used around the world in a wide range of care environments, from the Special Care Nursery to Pastoral and Palliative Care, and everything in between.

In December Nanyima welcomed a new volunteer – Rae Lloyd-Jones – who offers her time one afternoon a week to our residents, bringing calming peace and loving care expressed through music played on the Reverie Harp.

We have already seen a few of our Residents being blessed by this music, and look forward to other Residents having the opportunity to enjoy the simple pleasure of a one-on-one musical visit with Rae.
