Manager's View



Our celebration of Accreditation 2023-2026 claimed a lot of praise from those who joined the event – residents, staff, volunteers, Committee of Management members really banded together to join in the fun of the day. Special thanks to our events coordinators Pauline and Tanya, and everyone who provided them with all the assistance needed by the team. Thank you.

Nanyima Care is currently on 100% occupancy. This is a wonderful position to be in. We are keeping a close eye on our AN-ACC classifications and getting prepared to ensure that we can comply with the required 24/7 on site RN by 1 July 2023. We already have six (6) days a fortnight which has a full 24/7 RN cover, and the remaining eight (8) days are with an RN on-call who resides in the house within the premises. Having a really strong team of RNs would see us build confident team leaders to support a workforce achieving a common goal for our residents in our community.

This month of May, we are aiming to strengthen our workforce and we have added a couple of trainee AINs. We have also commenced the provision of First Aid and CPR training for relevant staff. A new defibrillator has been purchased and is now available onsite. We are hoping we would not need to use this on anyone, however, if we do it is here and relevant staff are trained to use it right.

One of our DTs – Michelle, successfully solicited donations towards the purchase of Tovertafel Devise for residents' activity. This is most exciting and we can't wait to see how our residents react. Huge thank you to Michelle to everyone in the community who helped us make this possible. New Star Rating should be published soon by My Aged Care for everyone to see. We trust that with recent successful accreditation and positive consumers survey, our star rating would be quite good for us.

Our Committee of Management has been attending some relevant industry governance trainings and looking at ways to strengthen our operation. Same is true for the effort we are putting in keeping involved with the Commissioner's webinars and consultations for the changes we all anticipate. National Mandatory Quality Indicators has just been expanded for reporting commencing in April, and we are getting our heads around the upcoming 24/7 RN coverage reporting comes July. Updates on these and more as we approach the roll out of these initiatives.
