# Manager's View



Welcome to our first newsletter in this financial year 2023-2024. What is in store for Nanyima Care team while we ride the changes unwrapping in our journey to better our services? We are keeping up for sure.

A letter to each of our staff is prepared to inform them of the changes in their wages because of the recent Aged Care wage increase and national minimum wage increase. Change in payment is applicable in the first full pay period on or after 30 June 2023.

Nanyima Care's two (2) Enterprise Agreement Bargaining are currently underway – one for nurses and one for the support staff. Relevant unions are involved in these negotiations. We hope to achieve great outcomes from these negotiations.

Nanyima Care has also commenced a process for obtaining a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with relevant unions in relation to supporting our ability to have access to overseas workforce when the need arises. Queensland Nurses and Midwifery Union (QNMU) is involved in the process with us.

The grant received for the Round 1 of Aged Care Registered Nurse payment has now been distributed to our Registered Nurses who were eligible for the grant.

Our application for IPC Lead Training Grant was also submitted for the two of our registered nurses recently enrolled in accredited course for this role. This will increase the number of our registered staff who would have the capacity to perform the role of IPC Lead for Nanyima Care.

It came to our attention that Triple capability RAT kits with TGA approval becomes available. We're now making sure that this is accessible for us in order to utilise the benefit it provides in testing symptomatic residents onsite. According to the <u>Department of Health and Aged Care</u>, on 4 May 2023, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) approved a combination rapid antigen test (RAT) kit *TouchBio RSV, FLU A/B & Covid-19 Rapid Antigen Combo* for self-testing (<u>ARTG 408459</u>) to aid in the diagnosis of COVID-19, Influenza A, Influenza B and RSV.

There is a new process in reporting Quality Indicators to the government which we need to abide by commencing this month. The Government Provider Management System (GPMS) will go live in July.

Nanyima Care commenced the process for seeking interest from our residents and relatives for our Consumer Advisory Committee for this year during the last Residents and Relatives Meeting. We will be sending out an invite to the relatives soon via email.




